We will be giving you a summer break and will not be holding meetings in June or July. This will give you the opportunity to spend more valuable time with your families. There is a lot going on with parks projects this summer and I have provided an update below.

In August we plan to have a meeting to discuss our Long Range Plan and the future vision of our parks. I encourage you to search Peter Kageyma online and watch some of his videos. He has unique and interesting ideas and visions for cities.

City Park Overlook-Erosion Control

The hill erosion work at the City Park overlook off of 3rd Ave SW is complete. New top soil fill and seed, erosion control mats and logs and numerous shrubs have been planted. A picket was installed at the top of the hill to deter people from going down the hill. Please see the attached photo of how nice this project turned out.

A new path will also be created through the trees heading north to the parking lot area. The path will be cleared and recycled fiber plastic timber stairs will be installed. A sign will be installed directing people to the new stairway path.

WPA wall repair

The work has been completed and all of the walls have been repaired. A photo has been attached to show the wonderful improvements made.

Tennis Court/Pickleball Update

Work has started on this project as well. Central Green will have two (2) tennis courts and four (4) pickleball courts this summer.

Restrooms and Fishing Pier at City Park (Legacy Grant)

The restroom construction is well under-way and is scheduled to be done at the end of July. The Fishing Pier has been approved and will also be complete by the end of July. We anticipate these projects to be complete for the start of our Summer Concert Series.



Ice Rinks

We are seeking proposals through the best value contracting process for the construction of two refrigerated ice rinks. Please see the attached Request for Proposal. An on-site meeting was held and five contractors interested in the project came to the site. City Council will be discussing the ice rink potential in July.

Splash Pad

We hope to have a discussion on this in August along with our long range plan and future vision discussion.

Brown Park

Our Public Works department removed over 50 dead oak trees last winter. All stumps were removed and the area was regraded. They replanted trees and bushes that came from the Isanti County Soil and Water Conservation District. The entire area was seeded with a mixture of Prairie/Savana grass and wildflowers with an oat cover crop supplied by Prairie Restorations of Princeton.



Request for Proposals through Best Value Contracting City of Cambridge Refrigerated Hockey Rinks

Project Construction Date: Fall 2016

Background

The City of Cambridge is seeking proposals through the best value contracting process for the construction of two refrigerated hockey rinks. Concrete surface for the refrigerated rinks is 87×204 with skating ice dimensions of $85' \times 200'$. Please see attached layout for additional details.

Please prepare a bid response that will meet or exceed the materials outlined below. All equipment proposed must be new equipment (not refurbished equipment) and meet or exceed current environmental standards for refrigeration.

Final consideration for awarding the bids will be based upon:

Experience in similar projects	30%
Cost & ongoing operational expenses	30%
Design, Layout, & Technical merits	20%
Contractor's interview	20%

Proposals must include, but not limited to, the following items for the construction and operation of the rinks:

- Refrigerant Mains
- Rink Floor Insulation
- Tubing Support Chairs
- Reverse Return Header System
- Rink Floor 1" Polyethylene Tubing
- Concrete Reinforcing
- Concrete perimeter curb
- Expansion Joints
- Concrete
- Chiller Package (environmentally friendly)
- Contractor must furnish and install copper piping and a refrigerant that any licensed HVAC/R contractor can work on (meaning no specialty license needed to perform the work).
- All electrical work included a pre-wired rack mounted electrical panel with circuit breakers, contractors, phase failure control, individually fused control circuits, pilot lights and toggle switches. Also include a control system with remote monitoring and transformer with fuses to accommodate 120-volt control circuit.
- Pumps, diffusers, service valve, insulation, thermometers and pressure gauges and interlocked with the compressor control system to maximize energy efficiency.
- The compressors and the circulating pumps must be wired to a single connection point.
 Preference is for an air-cooled condenser.
- Ice Rink Pumps for the chilled ice rink floor. One pump for the each chilled ice rink floors with piping that is insulated with 1 ½" Preformed Styrofoam Insulation with a white PVC Jacket.
- Projected operating costs including energy consumption (based upon three phase power).

Proposers should be open to working with the Cambridge Isanti Hockey Association on providing volunteer labor on items to help the project be cost effective. Parties interested in providing proposals are invited to a pre-proposal meeting on June 8 at 9:00 am at Cambridge City Hall, 300 3rd Avenue NE.

Proposals should be returned to Lynda Woulfe, City Administrator, City of Cambridge, 300 3rd Avenue NE, Cambridge, MN 55008 by 10:00 am on Friday, June 17. There will not be a public opening of the proposals, but they will be evaluated by the City's Technical Review Committee. Interviews for this project will take place on Thursday, June 23. The selected contractor will need to execute a contract and general conditions as prepared by the City.
